Awareness: Key Messages

- **Archives preserve Saskatchewan's past.** Millions of historical documents, photographs, maps and audio-visual materials are held in archives across the province. These records of Saskatchewan's past are indispensable in understanding our past and charting the future of the province and its relations.
- **Archives support Saskatchewan's economy.** Sustaining the knowledge-based economy of the province means sustaining and facilitating access to our knowledge resources. Archives are fundamental to the success of countless public, private, and educational enterprises.
- **Archives are struggling to serve their users.** The insufficient funding of archives limits our users (students, teachers, researchers, historians, journalists, lawyers, genealogists, and the general public) to the use of only a fraction of the knowledge contained in Saskatchewan's archives.
- **SCAA represents Saskatchewan archival institutions.** SCAA exists to assist over 46 archives and numerous individual archivists in the province. It contributes to the advance of preservation, organization, and accessibility of the province's rich archival heritage. As the voice of Saskatchewan's archives, SCAA programmes are essential to the archival community at large (archivists, archives, and users.)
- **SCAA serves the Saskatchewan public.** SCAA's work helps to ensure the promotion and preservation of Canada's heritage for the benefit of all Saskatchewanians-now and for the future. Through initiatives such as the Saskatchewan Archival Information Network (SAIN), the SCAA is the window through which the country and the world may access Saskatchewan archival information.

Saskatchewan's archives need Saskatchewan's support. As the sister institutions to museums and libraries, archives deserve equivalent support and a specific, dedicated stream of funding. Archival activities must be recognized within Saskatchewan's Heritage Policy Framework.

Public Awareness Strategies

As the SCAA looks towards the future it faces many strategic questions:

How can SCAA create public awareness about archives and their holdings?

How does SCAA achieve recognition as the provincial representative for the archival community?

How can SCAA be seen as the key provider of innovative and high quality programmes for the archival community?

How can SCAA increase funding to its programmes?

How can SCAA strengthen its partnerships with the public and private sectors?

How can SCAA ensure on-going financial viability and ultimate self-sufficiency?

In answer to these questions, SCAA has adopted the following strategies:

- Improve the overall visibility of the Saskatchewan archival system.
- Improve SCAA's corporate branding as the provincial representative for the archival community.
- Position SCAA as the key support provider of innovative and high quality programmes for the archival community.
- Deliver an innovative and customized mix of messages to the general public in order to introduce archives and promote archival holdings.
- Engage the membership in activities to support access to increased funding to the archival community.
- Build relationships with current and potential funding sources, both public and private sector.
- Strengthen current partnerships and explore new projects designed to enhance the visibility and support for the Saskatchewan archival system.

Communication with Government

As Canadians living in a democracy, we elect officials at the municipal, provincial, and federal level to whom we entrust the leadership of our communities. These officials are responsible to the public, just as the public is responsible for communicating their views to their officials. Our views have the potential to influence policy – plans of action developed to guide decision-making. Communicating with government ensures that your issue is considered and understood.

Letter Writing

- **Be informed.**
 - Research current policies on heritage and archives; keep an eye out for new government initiatives. The more you know, the more credibility you give to your arguments, and the more you identify yourself as a resource the government can call on for more information.
 - Avoid too much technical language the reader may not understand (not everyone understands what a fonds is.)
 - Be fastidious about spelling and grammar.
- **Be brief.**
 - Keep letters to no more than one page.
- **Be specific.**
 - Letters are most effective when focused on a particular issue.
- **Be polite.**
 - Follow formal letter formats as much as possible (see attached templates). Avoid a confrontational style. Use a word processor when possible, but be sure to sign the letter by hand.
- **Be yourself.**
 - Let the person you're writing know how you've been involved with archives. (For example: "As an archivist, I believe...", "As a historian...", or "As a student..."). Reveal the individual behind your

arguments and write what you know: how the issue addressed affects you and your community. Write on your personal stationary or on your organizational letterhead.

- **Request a response.**
 - Ask for the politician or policymaker to reply with his or her position on the issue you've addressed.

- **Call first.**
 - While letters are generally the most effective way to send a message, fax and email may also be used. Call the office of the official beforehand to ask how he or she prefers to be contacted and confirm you have the correct information.

Phone call or email

While less predictable (it may be difficult to speak directly with the individual you're looking for), a phone call can be an excellent approach to your advocacy efforts.

- As with letter writing, be informed, be brief, be specific, be polite, and be yourself.
- Don't let voice mail disappoint you. Be sure to leave a message, briefly stating who you are, what you wish to discuss, why you wish to discuss it with this individual in particular, and how you can be reached.
- When writing an email, be aware of your writing style, this will, most likely, become part of the public record. Be respectful and avoid text message short forms and emoticons (b4 = before, lol = laughing out loud, ☺ , :-D, ;-), etc.)

Setting up a meeting

Meeting with your Member of Legislative Assembly (MLA), Municipal Official (MO) or his or her staff is the most direct way to make an impression. A personal connection is a powerful tool for influence.

Tips:

- **Think locally.**
 - MLAs have two addresses, a legislature address and a constituency address (Some constituencies/ridings in Saskatchewan may have more.) Contact your MLA through the constituency office.
 - A Municipal government has two entities, the elected officials (Mayor and Councillors) and the administration (City Clerk, City Manager, etc.) Elected officials can come and go, but usually the administration stays. Depending on the issue (immediate concerns or long-term awareness) you may wish to contact both to cover your bases. All are reachable through the municipal government of the area (City Hall, Reeve Office, etc.)
- **Be respectful, but don't be intimidated.**
 - Identify yourself as a constituent-it's your elected official's duty to represent you.
- **Be flexible.**
 - If a meeting with the elected official can't be scheduled, ask if a staff member would be willing to meet to address your concerns. (In the case of an MLA this may be possible, but at the municipal level meetings may be scheduled with administration.)
- **Be prepared.**
 - Research your issue and your elected official's history - what issues has he or she supported in the past? Bring background information to leave with the official. Be able to present yourself and your issue in 90 seconds; be ready to elaborate according to questions and time constraints.
- **Say thanks.**
 - After the meeting, be sure to send a thank-you note to reinforce the relationship and reiterate the issue discussed.

Communication with Media

The media works to inform. Communicating with a broad range and large number of Saskatchewanians as well as Canadians, the media has the power to influence both the public and policymakers. Media coverage gives exposure to your issue, while hot media topics can quickly become part of the government's agenda.

Preparation and **timeliness** are the keys to successful media relations.

Preparation refers to:

- Research on the issue, be up-to-date on policies and current with the information available
- Identify a finite set of points you wish to communicate, do not overwhelm the reader with many issues
- Be able to back up those points by having background information ready to distribute
- Present yourself as an information resource on the topic

Think carefully before you speak or write. Grammar, spelling and punctuation will influence how seriously your letter or presentation is received by your audience.

Timeliness refers to:

- Making sure your news is current and newsworthy
- Respecting reporter/submission deadlines
- Responding quickly to phone calls and emails

There are a number of ways for you to make contact with the media. Three of the most effective methods are letters to the editor, op-ed columns, and press releases.

Write a letter to the editor

Writing a letter to the editor is an easy way to get your voice in print media. The editorial section of most newspapers is widely read, making a published letter a very effective means of spreading a message. (See the attached letter templates).

Tips:

- **Be current.** If you're writing in response to an article/editorial, be sure to be quick to get it in the mail. If you're not writing a rebuttal, give your letter a more up-to-the-minute feel by linking your ideas to currently debated legislation, the Speech from the Throne, recently publicized reports, the newly released budget, or upcoming holidays and events.
- **Be concise.** No more than 300 words. A succinct letter is less likely to be edited by the paper, so more likely to say exactly what you mean. Get a friend to help edit and proofread.
- **Be community minded.** Whether it's distributed across the country or within your neighbourhood, you want your letter to resonate with its readers. Remind your audience about how archives affect them -- their lives, their family, their community's culture. Finally, let them know what actions they can take to help.

Write an op-ed

An Op-Ed (Opposite-Editorial) column, in contrast with an Editorial, is an opinion piece signed and submitted by someone who is not part of the paper's personnel. Op-Eds are generally printed on the page opposite to the editorials, hence their name.

Unlike letters to the editor, an op-ed is generally expected to provide an expert opinion on the topic it presents. While in large papers they are usually the realm of CEOs and directors of organizations, any professional title you can use that suggests authority on the issue will lend weight to your arguments.

Tips:

- **Be focused.** Choose one, specific topic to write about.
- **Be factual.** Information is the commodity an editor is after. While a philosophical or academic essay, for example, may rely heavily on rhetoric to communicate an idea, newspaper writing emphasizes factual information.
- **Edit and proofread.** Pay attention to grammar and spelling. Get a friend or colleague to read over your op-ed before it's submitted.
- **Call first.** Submission guidelines vary from paper to paper. Generally the column is between 600 and 800 words and can be submitted by email,

however it may be worthwhile to contact the editor before writing your column.

Write a press release

A press release is written to alert the media to a story and convince them that it's newsworthy. (See attached template for a press release template)

Tips:

- **Make sure your story really is newsworthy.** Establish yourself as a reliable source by thinking like a journalist - will this story interest the audience?
- **Always write in the third person.** Remember that most news stories aim to be objective reports. With the exception of quotes from sources, a press release should be written entirely in the third person.
- **Be brief.** Keep most paragraphs to between three and five concise sentences. The release itself should be between half a page and two pages, with one page being the ideal length.
- **Follow the format.** Your press release needs to look like a press release or it won't be picked up.
- **Grab their attention with a good headline.** The headline should be catchy and summarize the content of the release in 6-8 words.
- **Begin with a bang.** Remember that newspaper writing calls for information to be organized like an inverted pyramid: the most important information at the beginning, the less important details towards the end. The beginning of the article is what's most likely to be read.
- **The first paragraph** should briefly recount the who, what, when, where, why, and how of your story.
- **Subsequent paragraphs** should supply the details and support the information given in the headline and first paragraph.
- **The last paragraph** should briefly profile your organization.
- **Edit and proofread.** Pay attention to grammar and spelling. Get a friend or colleague to read over your op-ed before it's submitted.

- **Remember: a good press release could be published as sent.** While reporters are used to weaving releases into articles, regional and community papers often simply print as is, keeping you in control of your message.

Communicating with the Public

Supporting Saskatchewanians in their discovery of archives is necessary for archives to become a policy priority. As the general public is largely unfamiliar with archives, don't miss this opportunity to educate your community and share your excitement about the riches to be found in its documentary heritage.

There are many ways to encourage interest in archives in your area. Here are some suggestions:

- **Involve your friends.** Next time you visit an archives, arrange to bring a friend or two. Help them find information about their ancestors, their hometown -- their areas of interest. They'll thank you for opening a new world of information to them.
- **Involve tourists.** Encourage visitors to your area to get a more in-depth look at its history by visiting the local archives.
- **Involve teachers.** Talk to teachers of history, social studies, aboriginal studies, and other relevant disciplines about the benefits of introducing primary sources to students. For students already keen on history, archives open a stimulating treasure trove of new resources; for those originally less interested, archives provide a more hands-on approach to history, making the student a detective putting together clues to the past.
- **Involve students.** Offer to give a lecture on archival research methods in high school history classes.
- **Involve your community.** Partner up with your local historical society to organize a heritage festival, public lectures, or an essay contest focusing on local history. Such an activity should present archives as an exciting and available knowledge resource.
- **Look out for new activists.** Make this advocacy kit available to them. Remember: less than an hour a month of your involvement can impact the fate of archives in Canada. Take the time to help preserve the past.

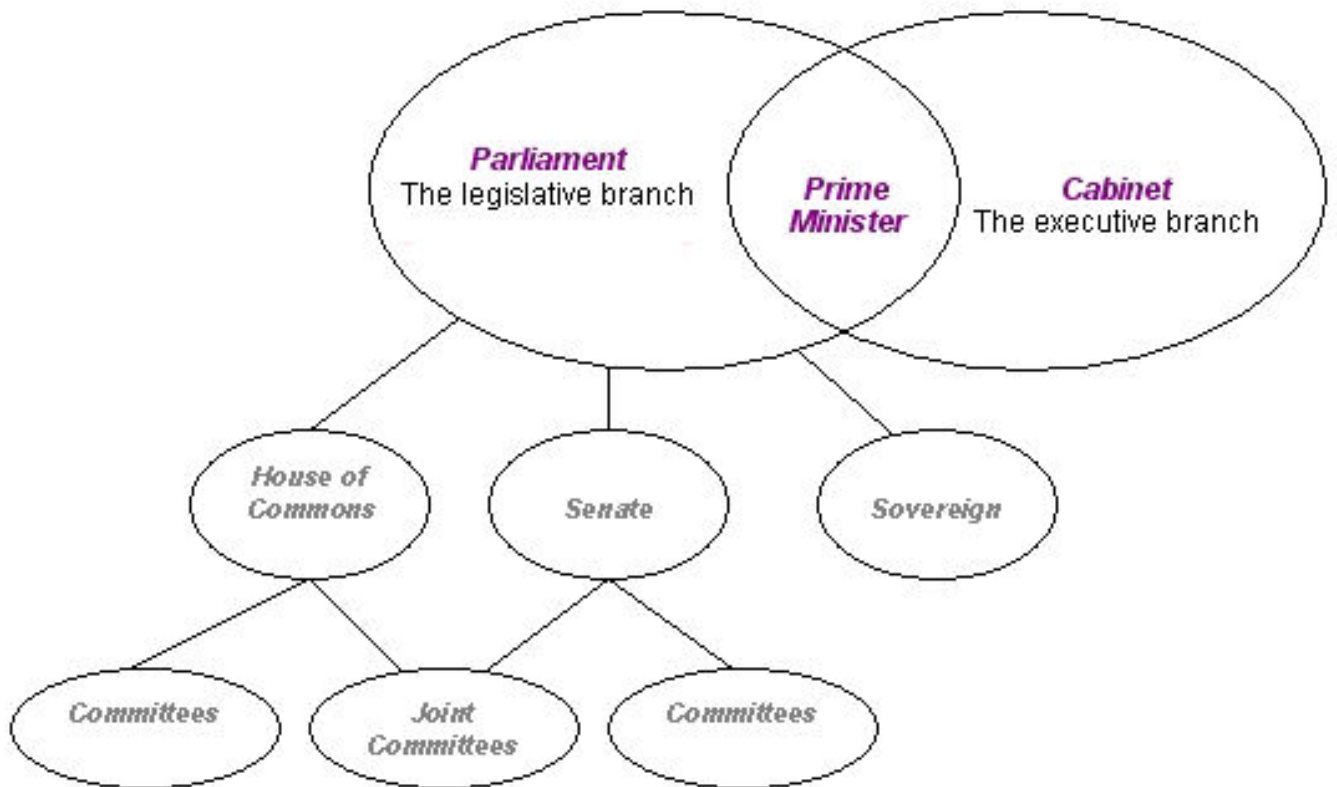

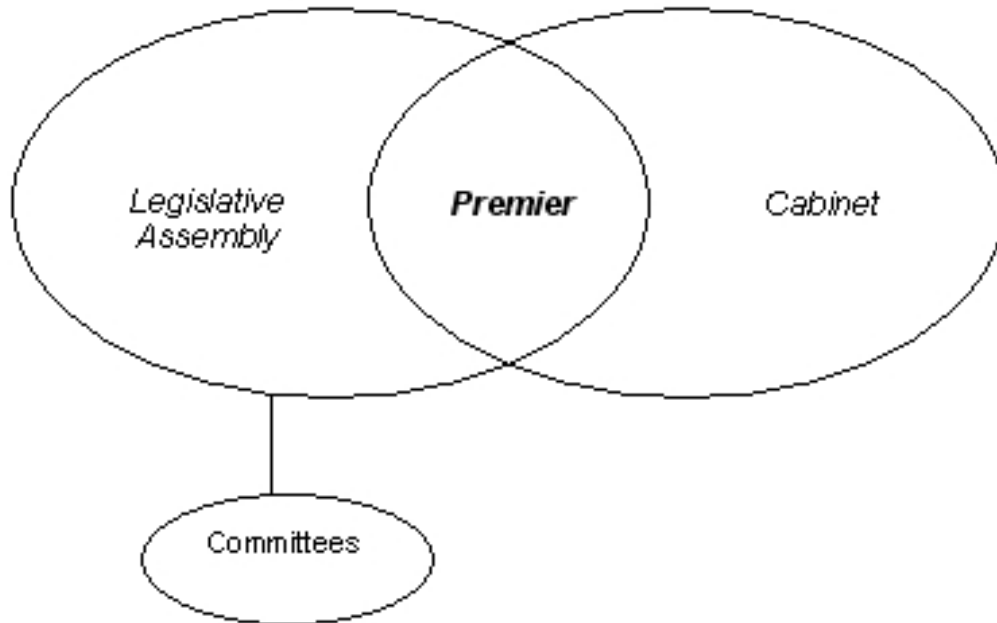

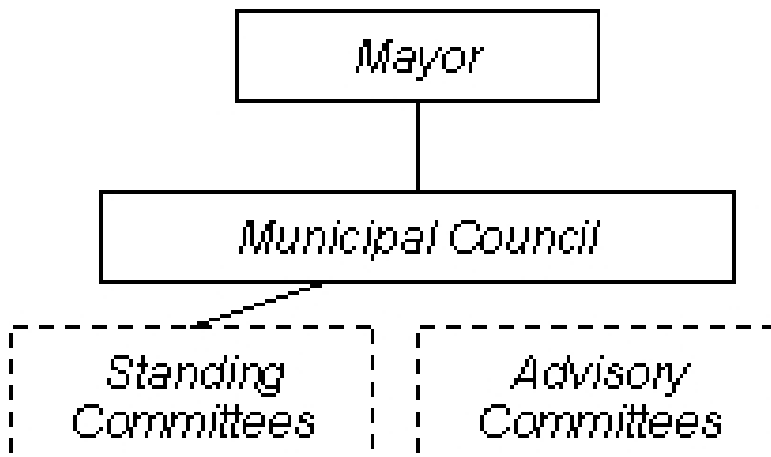

Why Archives Matter

Preservation of the past will propel a nation into the future – from the fusion of tradition and creativity our uniquely Canadian culture has come to life. The continued vitality of our society depends on this cultural heartbeat, sustained and enriched by a history as expansive as our nation itself. This history is not a mere chronology of events. Canada’s heritage is your heritage – your family legacy, your community history, as preserved in our country’s network of archives.

Archives are the personal and public records of individuals and organizations, conserved to get the full story. These records can take the form of family photographs, private diaries, maps, or medical charts, debate transcripts or postcards, together contributing to an understanding of times past. They are documentary monuments raised to every kind of Canadian, they are the narrative accompanying our heritage sites, they are testimonies to lives lived and lost, to the lives spent building our nation. Our archives are at the heart of our identity as Canadians.

They are also at risk of being lost forever, according to Sheila Fraser, Auditor General of Canada. In her 2003 report to the House of Commons she alerted Canadians to the precarious condition of cultural affairs, stating, “cultural heritage has suffered from the budget cuts of the last decade”. As our archival assets increase, so do the resources necessary to conserve them. However, the past ten years have seen a significant decrease in heritage funding that threatens archives, and in so doing jeopardizes the collective memory of Canadians.

According to twentieth century philosopher Bertrand Russell, the study of history allows us, “to combine the merits of drama or epic poetry with the merit of truth.” The need to preserve our past is clear; the call to action is urgent. Original documents cannot be replaced – damage is permanent, and once destroyed, they’re gone for good. Now it is upon all Canadians to take ownership of their archival heritage by actively committing to its conservation. These are your stories. Keep them alive.
